National Taiwan University YongLin Institute of Health Elite Graduate Student Scholarship Guidelines

1. Purpose

The YongLin Institute of Health, National Taiwan University (hereinafter referred to as "the Institute"), establishes these guidelines to encourage outstanding students with excellent academic performance to pursue studies in the <u>Graduate School of Advanced Technology --Program for Precision Health and Intelligent Medicine</u>, or to participate in research conducted by the Institute's faculty members.

2. Eligibility

- 1. Students who are employed full-time or part-time are **not** eligible to apply. Any recipient found in violation shall return any overpaid funds.
- 2. Eligible applicants include students officially registered in the **Doctoral Program in Precision Health** (College of Key Technologies, NTU) from the 1st to 4th year of study.
- Eligible applicants also include students officially registered in the Master's Program in Precision Health (College of Key Technologies, NTU) from the 1st to 2nd year of study.
- 4. Applicants must have a minimum GPA of **3.7 or above**, or rank within the **top 50%** of their class.
- 5. Special cases (e.g., recipients of competitive scholarships, direct-PhD fellowships, or industry-sponsored funding) will be reviewed by the Institute to determine eligibility.

3. Review Process

Applications will be reviewed **once per academic year**. Applicants who meet the eligibility requirements shall submit the application form and relevant documents to the Institute. The list of recipients will be announced after review and approval by the Institute Affairs Meeting.

4. Scholarship Amount

- 1. Master's students: up to NT\$20,000 per month.
- 2. Doctoral students: up to NT\$40,000 per month.

5. Award Limitations

The total amount of scholarships and stipends received from NTU public budgets and government-related funds shall not exceed the maximum monthly limit set by these guidelines.

6. Required Documents

(1) Master's Students

- 1. Application form
- 2. Undergraduate transcripts
- 3. Proof of class ranking (undergraduate)
- 4. Research proposal
- 5. At least one recommendation letter
- 6. Proof of outstanding research performance (if applicable)
- 7. Other supporting documents (if applicable)

(2) Doctoral Students

- 1. Application form
- 2. Official transcript of the most recent academic year
- 3. Proof of enrollment (official copy)
- 4. A copy of the Alien Resident Certificate (for international students)
- 5. Research proposal
- 6. At least one recommendation letter
- 7. Proof of outstanding research performance (if applicable)
- 8. Other supporting documents (if applicable)

7. Renewal

Recipients applying for renewal must submit their most recent academic transcript or research achievements for review by the Institute Affairs Meeting.

8. Disbursement

Recipients must claim their scholarship in accordance with the announcement issued by the Institute. Scholarships not claimed within **one year** from the announcement date shall be considered forfeited and will not be reissued.

9. Revocation

If a recipient is found to have violated academic ethics or engaged in conduct that damages the Institute's reputation, the Institute Affairs Meeting may revoke the scholarship.

10. Implementation

These guidelines shall take effect from the date of promulgation after approval by the Institute Affairs Meeting.
